The Great White Way: Race and the American Musical (2018)

A foundational course in written and oral communication, critical thinking and analysis, and an introduction to research methods. This course focuses upon the history of the American Musical Theatre tradition, characterization of race and ethnicity on stage, and the continued debate between color-blind and color-conscious casting.

Staging Revolution: Making the Case for Universal Human Rights (2009, 2013)

A foundational course in written and oral communication, critical thinking and analysis, and an introduction to research methods. In this course, students connected human rights declarations and theory with dramatic play texts as a method for examining and responding to human rights abuses.

Theatre and Dance Courses, Grinnell College

Introduction to Technical Theatre:

A stagecraft requirement for all Theatre and Dance Majors, with a focus upon support of departmental mainstage productions.

Introduction to Theatrical Design and Technology:

A curricular replacement for Introduction to Technical Theatre utilizing more experiential and inquiry-based learning practices, with a focus upon the ways design and technology impact performance style.

Design for Performance I:

Foundation course in Theatrical Design with an emphasis on design process, which includes script analysis, visual and dramaturgical research, drawing/sketching, visual composition, model-building, and costume rendering.

Design for Performance II:

Advanced course in Performance Design with flexible content (scenic design, lighting design, projection/media design, and sound design).

Lighting for the Stage:

Introduction to the lighting design process, script analysis for the lighting designer, and pertinent electrical and design techniques utilized in lighting design.

Stage and Production Management:

Advanced course in production skills and techniques needed to manage the production process.

Digital Media Design in Performance:

Intermediate course in digital media development, including audio and visual design elements.

Stage Properties Design:

A guided research project through art history and period stage design of theatrical properties.

Advanced Programming for Lighting Design:

A guided research project involving a series of small lighting design projects, which allowed for students to investigate programming intelligent lighting fixtures across multiple platforms.

Advanced Lighting Design:

An independent study project in conceptual formulation, visual research, and design of lighting for multiple design projects, including the Grinnell/Newbugh High School production of *Arsenic and Old Lace*.

Advanced Scenic Design:

An independent study project in conceptual formulation, visual research, and design of scenery for Sarah Ruhl's *Eurydice*.

Interactivity in Design

An independent study course examining the technologies and applications of interactive elements in the world of performance design. The outcome of the course will be six separate designed, interactive spaces that allow for students to examine possibilities of interactive design across multiple populations from inexperienced audiences to student designers and professional performers.

Theatrical Metal Working:

A guided research project involving the design and implementation of scenery, weaponry, jewelry, and other stage properties.

Performance Lab, Design and Technology:

An experiential learning, one-credit course working on aspects of design and technological implementation of production design.
